DORMITORY ROOMS

Each dorm room contains a bed with a mattress (twin size), a desk, closet, dresser, garbage can and desk chair for each student. Below are lists of items to bring and not to bring when coming to NCC. Many of these items can be purchased upon arrival in Canada. There will be an opportunity during the first weekend on campus for students to shop for items that they need as well as shopping trips 2-3 times a week throughout the school year.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

- Over the counter medication or herbal supplements (all over the counter medicine will be supplied and distributed through the NCC Health Centre)
- Peanut products
- Cooking appliances (they will be available in the permitted cooking areas, and are not permitted in rooms)
- Televisions
- Computer screens over 24"
- Microwaves
- Pets/Animals
- Candles or incense
- Matches or lighters (non-smoking)
- Weapons (knives, slingshots, paint-ball guns, etc.) (actual or replicas)
- Cooking knives with blades larger than 4.5 inches (Cooking knives will be supplied by the dormitory)
- Banned substances (alcohol or drugs including but not limited to synthetic marijuana, vaping devices etc.)

Each student should expect to have a roommate. Each student is responsible to keep his or her room clean and neat. This means keeping clothes in closets or dressers and vacuuming regularly. Students should not bring excessive amounts of personal items as they may cause clutter and distract from a positive study environment. All boarding students will take responsibility in keeping hallways, common rooms, and washrooms tidy.

DORMITORY AMENITIES

There are coin-operated laundry facilities located in each dormitory. Irons and ironing boards are also available. Lounges in all dormitories are equipped with couches, televisions, microwaves, and refrigerators.

A student recreation centre (The Wrec Centre) provides many social and recreational opportunities for students. The Wrec Centre is centrally located between the two main dormitory, only steps away from their front entrances. The Wrec Centre includes: billiards, table tennis, a TV, comfortable couches and chairs, wireless internet access, foosball, gaming systems, and a selection of board games as well as a snack bar for purchasing items during most evenings.

Students can access wireless internet in their rooms and across most of our campus. Students will have access to NCC's wireless internet service until 11:30 pm on school nights.

School supplies such as pens, pencils, binders, paper, etc. can be purchased at stores in the Fort Erie area. NCC will provide assistance in purchasing school uniforms, textbooks and Physical Education uniforms during Orientation sessions.

In order to better serve our students we ask that a credit card number be filed in the office for necessary purchases. This information will be kept in our safe and used only for authorized purchases: textbooks, uniforms, school trips, etc.

Although each student room can be locked, the school discourages the keeping of money and valuable articles in dorm rooms. All boarding students will give their passport, visa, and other important papers to their Campus Life Director to be kept in the Dormitory Safe. A student banking service is provided in the office for all students, and the ATM on campus accepts most international cards. Students are able to deposit and withdraw money during weekday office hours. We will also assist students in setting up a personal bank account at the Royal Bank of Canada (Jarvis St. Branch, Fort Erie) during Orientation.

BEHAVIOUR

Students are expected to develop a respect for themselves, for others, and for God. Complete rules of the school will be explained in detail during Orientation with emphasis on positive actions and attitude. Incidents involving violence, alcohol or drugs may result in an immediate suspension or expulsion from school, fines, and possible police involvement. Current law in Ontario states that it is illegal to smoke or vape on any school grounds. In the event that a student is asked to leave NCC there will be no refunds issued.

TRANSPORTATION & TRAVEL

Students can leave the NCC campus only with permission from a Campus Life Staff member. If permission is granted, students must sign out of the school providing information on the destination, the length of the trip, and how they can be contacted.

If a student plans on being away overnight, NCC Campus Life Staff must receive communication granting permission from parents at least 2 days in advance. Parents may phone or e-mail a note of permission to the Campus Life Director. Please provide a contact e-mail address and phone number that will be used throughout the school year for parent or agent contact. If this email is not received, a student will be denied permission.

Upon arrival in Toronto, NCC will cover the cost of transportation from the airport to campus for all new students. Subsequent trips must be paid for by the student. Niagara Airbus transportation is available for students going to and from the airport during holidays. Reservations can be made online at niagaraairbus.com with a credit card.
